



HOW TO CLEAN CHAPS

Chaps or Chinks with Tooled Belt

- ❖ **Work glycerine soap into lather loosening dirt from surface with sponge & warm water. Flush dirt off surface, do not grind in**
- ❖ **Do not damage surface by overscrubbing or getting overly wet**
- ❖ **May be necessary to go over high wear areas twice**
- ❖ **Once cleaned, lay out on table (no sun, no heat)**
- ❖ **Lay fringe out so that it dries flat (can lay board over)**
- ❖ **Before completely dry, loosen leather up with hands (rub together or it will get stiff & boardy)**

ROUGHOUT ONLY

- ❖ **Once dry, take sandpaper or suede brush & lift surface back up gently**
- ❖ **Sand or brush whole surface (may change color slightly)**
- ❖ **Avoid stitching**

ROUGHOUT OR GLOVE TAN

- ❖ **Wash on delicate cycle with Ivory dishsoap**
- ❖ **Pull out half way thru wash cycle & rub xtra soap in grimy areas**
- ❖ **Lay out on table & pull back into original size**
- ❖ **Before completely dry put in dryer no heat**
- ❖ **Cover buckle as it may damage chaps**
